Emergencies and disasters that affect the health and welfare of the public may quickly overwhelm the ability of the Clayton Public Health District to meet the needs of the public. Thus, volunteers will be needed to supplement the local public health response to, and recovery from, emergencies and disasters.

Course Objectives:

- Describe the purpose of the District 3-3 PHVIP.
- Describe public health's roles and responsibilities during an emergency/disaster.
- Identify when, where, and why public health volunteers will be asked to respond.
- identify the types of emergencies/disasters that may require a public health response.
- Identify steps you and your family should take before an emergency/disaster to ensure your safety.
- Describe how you would be contacted (activated) if needed in response to an emergency/disaster.
- Identify your role as a public health volunteer and what you will likely do in an emergency/disaster response.
- Discuss the incident management system used in emergency response.
