No person may begin the physical development of a lot or the installation of an on-site sewage system management without having first applied for and received a written on-site sewage system management permit by the Clayton County Health Department. The Clayton County Health Department shall approve or disapprove such septic application within twenty days after the receipt of a completed application.

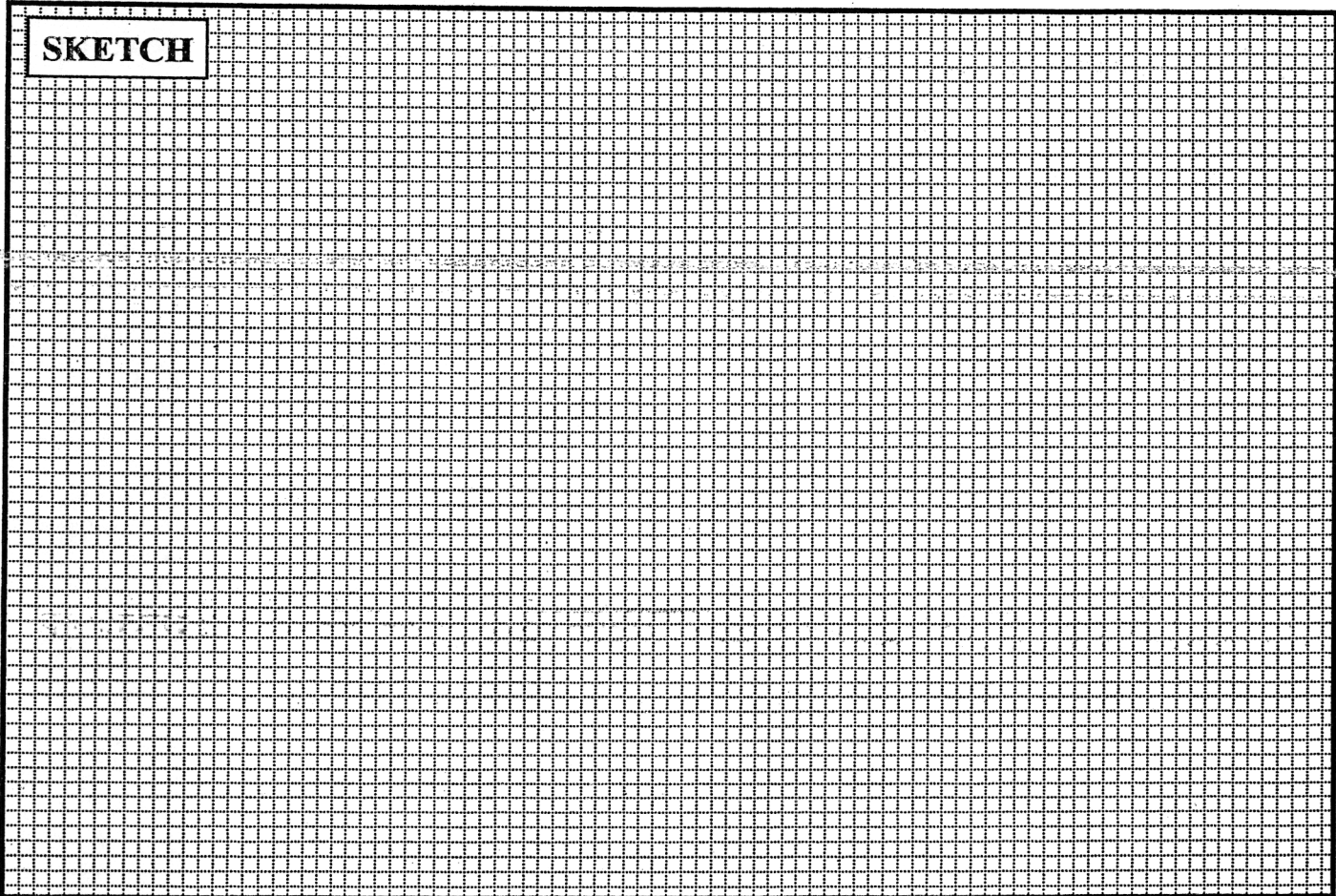
Lot suitability and approval will be determined by all the information submitted in accordance to the criteria established by the DHR current manual for on-site sewage management systems.
